



Caledonian Showing Championships

This show is a qualifier for the Caledonian Showing Championships, which offers competitors the opportunity to compete at a top-level Championship Final in Scotland. With a draped main arena, amazing rosettes, special prizes, music, judges from the south and atmospheric Evening Performances, this is the show everyone wants to be part of.

This year's show will be held at Highfield @ Howe, near Ladybank, Fife

Every horse & pony placed 1st and 2nd in all In Hand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. All Champions & Reserves will qualify for the Champion & Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line. Qualification is for the Horse & Pony except for Adult/Young Handler classes, where the Handler qualifies.

All qualified horses and ponies will be listed on the Caledonian Showing Show's website www.caledonianchampionships.webs.com where you will also find a regularly updated list of qualifying shows and a wealth of other information.

PERTH EQUINE VETS / BHS Scotland Open Working Hunter Riding Series 2022

The course: At least 8 and not more than 12 fences, with changes of direction, must be set in a ring large enough to permit jumping fluently at a fair hunting pace. Fences should be rustic or as natural as possible, not easily dislodged, of solid appearance, well filled and with shrubs as wings. Maximum height 3ft 6ins (1.05m), maximum spread 3ft 9ins (1.12m), except open ditch and water. The course **should be set at, or near, maximum** unless the judge considers that the ground makes this unsafe. Normally at least one upright and one spread must be at maximum.

Qualification: The first THREE qualify for the final, even if they did not jump clear. If one of the first three has already qualified the qualifying card can be passed down to fourth place provided the 4th placed rider jumped clear. If a class has less than 4 entries, only the winner will qualify for the Championships.

Blair Castle Working Hunter Pony Series

Class numbers 85-87 are qualifiers. Ponies placed first to fourth in each class will qualify for the Championships held at Blair Castle International Horse Trials and Country Fair on Thursday 25th August 2022. Qualification may go down to sixth place if higher placed ponies have previously qualified.

CHAPS (UK)

This show is affiliated to the Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK). Affiliation No. 22-015. Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However, in order to Qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be a current showing member and hold a valid Qualifier Card. The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 11th – 13th August 2022. Members to apply to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card.

The following classes (23-27) are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers. For full rulings and information on competition/qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members' Handbook; or visit www.chapsuk.com for rulings. Only 'Coloured' horses and ponies (as defined in the current CHAPS UK Members' Handbook) may compete these classes.

All Stallions, 4 years old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK). All stallions must wear Stallion ID Discs in the ring without exception.

Veteran Horse Society – AREA QUALIFIER 2022

First round qualifier for the Veteran Horse Society Supreme Final: VETERAN HORSE OF THE YEAR 2022 (Kindly Sponsored by Allen & Page).

Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each age category will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their cards in the ring and have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership. It is the competitor's responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge.

Regional Finals are open to members only.

All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, to be held at Arena UK Lincolnshire on 30th September – 02nd October 2022. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule.

NPS (The National Pony Society) – Affiliation Number: S1.074

NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part bred are not eligible for Mountain & Moorland Classes. To compete in Show Pony and Show Hunter Pony classes ponies must be registered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register, Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB, the GSB, the AHSB, the AASB or in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part-Breds are not eligible unless entered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register, Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 02nd – 4th August 2022.

The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.

NPS Coriscaron Horse Essentials Home-Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home-Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards MUST be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

The NPS/POTTOFIELDS STUD M&M In Hand Summer Championship (MM-IH)

Classes 36-39 are open to pure bred registered M&M ponies in the main body of their studbook. Owner's membership cards must be shown in the ring to receive qualifications. Foals are not eligible.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championship: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the

rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show **02nd – 4th August 2022**.

NPS/CUDDINGTON STUD M&M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship

(SM-MMIH): A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life member in the M&M In Hand section. The Sponsor's Rosette is also awarded to the pony receiving the qualification. Membership cards must be presented in the ring to receive the medal and/or the qualification. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in either the NPS / Cuddington Stud M&M In-Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show in Malvern, or at the Championship Show in Scotland. Qualifiers may only compete in one Cuddington final.

This Show is a qualifier for The BSPS Scotland Members Champion of the Year competition to be held at BSPS Scotland Finale Show on the 03rd September 2022. 1st prize winners in the Lead Rein and First Ridden Show Pony, Pony of Hunter Type, Heritage M&M classes, Open Show Pony, Open Pony of Show Hunter Type, Open Intermediate SRT and SHT, Heritage M&M Open Ridden classes will qualify. In the event of the 1st placed winner at this show having already qualified for the BSPS Scotland Members Champion of the Year, the qualification will be the highest placed BSPS Scottish Member (not already qualified), from the first THREE ponies placed in each class. The rider/pony combination who qualify in each class will be subject to written confirmation from BSPS Scotland.

BRITISH SHOW PONY SOCIETY Affiliation No. 22-003 / 178

Hats should have a plain cover either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. Velvet covers are encouraged. BSPS SCOTLAND ACCEPTS NO RESPONSIBILITY FOR ANY INJURY ARISING FROM A FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS REGULATION. HAT CHECKS FOR COMPLIANCE WILL BE MADE.

Body Protectors

Body Protectors MUST be worn when jumping in any WHP and WH classes including practice ring at B.S.P.S. Affiliated Shows. (Including Tiny Tots, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WSP, LRWSP and Training Stakes). Riders must wear a body protector when working in (practice jumps) and the jumping phase in all B.S.P.S. organised and affiliated events.

Marking System: To be judged 60% for jumping performance, 40% as for Hunter Classes. The Jumping to be judged 40% actual jumping and 20% style and presence. Ride and conformation 40%. Fences to a minimum of eight in number. No change of rider or tack will be allowed. The manner of going to be taken into account. Refusals to be severely penalised. Penalties: 1st Refusal - 15; 2nd Refusal - 20; 3rd Refusal - Elimination; Knockdown - 10; Fall of Horse or Rider – Elimination; Landing with fore feet in the water – 10 (Dropping hind feet in the water should not incur faults, but may involve loss of style points). (As copied from Rule Book).

Class 1 Novice Working Hunter for horses exceeding 148cm. Not to have won a first prize at any show, including BSPS. Max fence height 2'9".

Class 2 Intermediate Working Hunter for horses exceeding 148cm. Max fence height 3'.

Class 3 Working Hunter for horses exceeding 148cm. Max fence height 3'3".

Class 4 Open Working Hunter – Perth Equine Vets / BHS Scotland Open Working Hunter Riding Series 2022.

The Horse must be four years old and over exceeding 148cm (14.2hh approx.). The rider must be a member of the British Horse Society. Riders eighteen years or over on the day of the Finals. **The course:** At least 8 and not more than 12 fences, with changes of direction, must be set in a ring large enough to permit jumping fluently at a fair hunting pace. Fences should be rustic or as natural as possible, not easily dislodged, of solid appearance, well filled and with shrubs as wings. Maximum height 3ft 6ins (1.05m), maximum spread 3ft 9ins (1.12m), except open ditch and water. The course **should be set at, or near, maximum** unless the judge considers that the ground makes this unsafe. Normally at least one upright and one spread must be at maximum.

“Blair Castle International Horse Trials and Country Fair Qualifier: The first THREE prize winners will qualify for the final in August 2022 at Blair Castle International Horse Trials, even if they did not jump clear. If one of the first three has already qualified the qualifying card can be passed down to fourth place provided, they jumped clear. Receive remuneration, whether it be monetary or goods in kind, for employment in the connection with horses in racing, showing, livery stable or riding schools (instruction at Pony Club, Area Teach-Ins and Riding Clubs excepted). This does not include the suppliers of ancillary services such as farriers and vets.
- 281. Own / Part Own an equestrian establishment including but not limited to riding schools, events Centre, stud or livery yard in any capacity, or receive any form of remuneration for employment at an equestrian establishment. For the avoidance of doubt for the purpose of this rule, immediate family members of an owner or part owner of an equestrian establishment who work or are howsoever otherwise engaged or involved in any capacity, whether or not for remuneration at the equestrian establishment, will be treated as being an owner or part owner of that equestrian establishment.
- 282. Show a Pony owned or sponsored by a company or a commercial firm, or act as a Brand Ambassador, in any showing classes or a Pony for which his/her immediate family accepts livery or training charges from a person outside the immediate family concerned. **No commercial branding can be visible in the ring, during a class, this applies to equines, riders and any attendees.**
- 283. A competitor is not eligible to compete in any classes on an animal which has been ridden by a Rider who rides for a Professional Producer/Trainer in any Showing Classes or otherwise during the current year.

ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AFTER THESE DATES and no reminders will be given. Fax and e-mail entries will not be accepted at any time.
2. Thereafter, if circumstances allow 'ON THE DAY ENTRIES' may be accepted AT DOUBLE ENTRY FEE.
3. POSTAL ENTRY FORMS should be filled in as clearly as possible, preferably in BLOCK LETTERS.
The name entered under Exhibitor's Name POSTAL & ONLINE is the one that will be used in the results.
4. COMPLETED POSTAL ENTRY FORMS should be carefully checked and signed by the Exhibitor or their Agent and sent by post to: Light Horse Entries, Ayr County Show, Gibbs Yard Steading, Auchincruive, Ayr KA6 5HW. Please ensure parents countersign children's entries.
COMPLETED ONLINE ENTRY will require to be carefully checked with Rules & Regulations of the Association AGREED.
5. NO REFUND OF ENTRIES WILL BE MADE.
6. ADMISSION TICKET ALLOCATIONS FOR LIGHT HORSE & PONY SECTION: 1 horse – 2 wristbands; 2-4 horses – 3 wristbands; over 4 horses – 5 wristbands.

14. PROTESTS - any protest must be lodged by a person having an interest. The said objections must be lodged in writing with the Secretary at the Show or within seven days of the Show, and must state specifically the grounds of objection, and must be accompanied by a deposit of £100.
15. WEARING OF RIDING HATS - All riders must wear hats that conform to the current BSI standards.
16. Body Protectors MUST be worn when jumping in any WHP AND WH classes including in the practice ring at BSPS affiliated shows.
17. DOGS - should be kept on the lead at all times.
18. STABLES – There will be no stabling at Ayr Racecourse for exhibitors this year - a list of private stabling within 25 miles of Ayr can be found on inside back cover of schedule.
19. The Horse Passports (Scotland) Regulations 2005, Amended 2007, replaces the Horse Passport (Scotland) Regulations 2005, and requires all equidae (horses, ponies, donkeys, asses and mules), regardless of age or status, to be accompanied by a passport. Animals born or passports issued, on or after 1 July 2009 must be fitted with a microchip.
This would include, without exception, equines used for agricultural purposes, riding ponies, pets, companion animals, hacks, competition animals etc. Foals that are unweaned and accompanying their dam or foster mare may move to a show without a passport.
Passports can be held by the horse owner or keeper but should remain with the horse at all times; in particular, passports must accompany the horse when it is moved.
20. All Animals attending the Show must have proof of an up-to-date vaccination record
21. The Organisers retain the right to amend the schedule to facilitate the smooth running of the show.
22. Foul language or abusive behaviour towards people or animals will NOT be tolerated, and will result in expulsion from the Show ground.
23. Competitors are required to take home any rubbish as a matter of courtesy.
24. First aid cover will be available for the duration of the show.
25. A Vet will be available for the duration of the show.
26. No Farrier will be available.
