REGULATIONS GENERAL CONDITIONS

- ENTRY FORMS should be completed in BLOCK CAPITALS and lodged with the Secretary
 as early as possible and NO LATER THAN the date entries close.
- 2. ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AFTER THE DATES SHOWN ON THE FORM & INSIDE FRONT COVER OF THE SCHEDULE, TELEPHONE, FAX AND E-MAIL ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. NO REMINDERS WILL BE GIVEN.
- 3. ADDITIONAL ENTRY FORMS. Please telephone the office requesting additional form(s), as soon as possible, or photocopy your original form. Do you put more than one exhibitor on a form?
- 4. IN CLASSES FOR GROUPS AND PAIRS the Name and Pedigree of Animal or Animals does not require to be given. Simply give the name and address of the Exhibitor and the Class Number.
- 5. PAYMENT. All entries must be accompanied by the correct amount, including membership subscription, where applicable, Cheques or postal order made payable to AYRSHIRE AGRICULTURAL ASSOCIATION. No entry will be deemed to be accepted until all entry monies have been paid.
- 6. RIGHT RESERVED TO REFUSE ENTRIES. The Show Committee reserve to themselves the right of refusing, cancelling or prohibiting the exhibition of Entries from any person who has been expelled from the Membership of any Agricultural or Dairy Society or who may have been prohibited, suspended or disqualified from making entries or exhibiting at the Show or Shows of any Agricultural or Dairy Society, or Breed Society in consequence of having attempted to obtain a prize by giving a false Certificate or by unfair means, or who is under exclusion from any Breed Society for fraudulent practices. The Show Committee further reserve to themselves the right of refusing any other entries they may think fit to exclude, or to cancel any entry made, or to prohibit the exhibition of any entry.
- WITHDRAWAL OF ENTRIES should be intimated to the Secretary two weeks before the Show. No refund of Entry Fees will be made for cancellations received after this date. (Dairy Cattle not included).
- **8. ALL SECTIONS.** Sections may be cancelled or amalgamated at steward's discretion if less than 3 exhibitors and 9 animals in total.
- 9. THE AYRSHIRE AGRICULTURAL ASSOCIATION IS NOT LIABLE FOR LOSS OR DAMAGE pertaining to or connected with any exhibitor or exhibit sustained at the Show or in transit. Neither will The Association be accountable for any accident that may occur to any person attending the Show whether as a visitor, exhibitor or otherwise.
- 10. STOCK SUBJECT TO ORDER OF OFFICIALS. Stock entered for Competition, and actually in the Show, is subject to the Control and under the orders of the Show Committee, Stewards, Secretary and other Show Officials, and such Stock may not be withdrawn from competition or from parade without the consent of the Committee or Secretary.
- 11. PERSONS INTERFERING WITH JUDGES ETC. Persons making insulting remarks to, or in any way unduly interfering with the Judges, Stewards or other Officials while in the performance of their duties, and all Exhibitors and others in charge of Stock while in the Judging Rings, refusing to accept or display Tickets, Rosettes, etc. awarded by the Judges and handed to them by the Stewards or other Officials, or tearing up Tickets, Rosettes, etc. so awarded or handed to them, or acting in any similar manner shall be considered guilty of misconduct, and shall be dealt with under these Rules.

- 12. EXHIBITORS ANSWERABLE FOR CONDUCT OF EMPLOYEES, ETC. All persons in charge of Stock or other exhibits, and all persons admitted into the Show yard, shall be subject to the Rules of Ayrshire Agricultural Association and shall obey the orders of the Secretary, Stewards and other Officials of the Association. Exhibitors shall be answerable for the conduct of their employees or representatives.
- **13. POWER TO ENFORCE REGULATIONS.** The Stewards and other Officials have power to enforce the Regulations of The Association in their different departments.
- 14. PROTESTS. A protest, having reference to Exhibits at the Show, may be lodged by any person having interest. Said objections, however, must be lodged in writing with the Secretary within seven days of the close of the Show, and must state specifically the grounds of objection, and must be accompanied by a deposit of £5 except in cases where the objection is laid by the Show Committee in which case the objections may be made at any time and a deposit shall not be necessary and which deposit shall, if the objection be proved frivolous to the satisfaction of the Directors, be forfeited. Said protest will be heard and determined by the Directors.
- 15. THE VIOLATION OF ANY OF THE REGULATIONS, or disobedience of the Directors, Show Committee, Secretary, Stewards, or other Officials of The Association, shall render the offending person liable to forfeiture of all premiums awarded to him or of such a portion as the Directors may ordain, and also liable to be expelled from the Membership of The Association, and disqualified from again, or for a certain number of years, exhibiting at the Shows of The Association, or to have his case disposed of by fines or otherwise as the Directors may determine.
- 16. THE DECISION OF THE DIRECTORS SHALL BE FINAL in the case of protests made in virtue of Regulation 15 hereof, and in every other matter arising at or in connection with the Show, be final, and every person present at the Show, whether as a Judge, Exhibitor, Visitor or otherwise, shall be deemed thereby to have agreed to refer the subject matter of such decision to the final determination of the Directors, to the exclusion of all Courts of Law.
- 17. DECISIONS MAY BE COMMUNICATED TO OUR SOCIETIES. All decisions under these Rules may, along with the names and addresses of the persons against whom such decisions have been pronounced, be communicated by the Secretary of this Association to the Secretaries of all Agricultural or Dairy Societies holding open Shows in the United Kingdom, and to the Secretaries of all Breed Societies in the United Kingdom, and may be published in the Annual Reports of this Association and in such newspapers or journals as the Directors may determine, and every Exhibitor competing at the Show, and every person present at the Show, whether as a Director, Member of Committee, Steward, Judge, Exhibitor, Visitor or otherwise, shall be deemed thereby to have consented to such communication and publications.
- 18. NO SHEETS shall be erected in front of the Cattle between 8 am and the close of the Show.
- 19. REMOVAL OF STOCK. Exhibitors of Stock will not be permitted to remove their exhibits from the Showground between the commencement of the Show and the time fixed of 6.00 pm for removal of exhibits on the Saturday afternoon or following Livestock Parade, except on production of a certificate from the official Veterinary Surgeons. Exhibitors contravening this rule will be liable to forfeit all prize money awarded.
- **20. THE HOLSTEIN SECTION** is restricted to Animals registered with the HFS Herd Book proper or the Holstein Herd Book, or Classes B or C of the Supplementary Register.
- 21. ONLY ONE STALL. When an Animal is to compete in two Classes it must be entered in both, but the Secretary must be informed when an animal is thus entered twice, so that only one running number may be given and one stall erected.
- 22. COWS AND HEIFERS SHOWN IN CALF in Classes 1 and 4 must be due to calve not later than 1st July.

- **23. CATTLE BYRES.** The storage of feeding stuffs, boxes, etc. in the passages is strictly prohibited. Smoking within the cattle byres is prohibited. The cooking of meals within the byres is also prohibited.
- **24. CALCULATION OF AGE.** Where age is not otherwise regulated, it is calculated from 1st January of each year in which the Animal was produced.
- 25. STOCK MUST BE THE BONA-FIDE PROPERTY OF THE EXHIBITOR. Except where otherwise provided Stock may be purchased up to the last date of entry, but must be the bona-fide property of the Exhibitor in whose name it is entered, and must have been in his possession from last day of entry to date of Show, and in case of Sale, delivery must have been given and the price paid.
- 26. OWNERS OF CATTLE AND HORSES MAY LEAD THEIR OWN STOCK into the Judging Ring with each lot exhibited. In the case of Clydesdale Horses, there has to be one handler and one groom only in the judging ring at any time. In the case of Sheep, only one person is allowed to enter the Judging Ring with each lot exhibited. Stock must be led by a responsible, experienced person.
- 27. BEEF CATTLE BREEDS. The use of a `humbug' is mandatory for all Breeds of Cattle.
- 28. SECURING OF ANIMALS. Bulls must be secured by a ring in the Nose, with a Rope or Chain attached. All Cattle must be securely tied in the Stalls, and in the case of Horses, one person must be in constant attendance on each Animal.
- 29. EXHIBITORS SHALL BE ANSWERABLE for all acts, whether committed by themselves, their employees, or others in charge of their Stock; and shall be responsible for their Animals during the whole time they remain in the Show yard. Except when being taken to the Judging Ring, no Animal may be unstalled without the sanction of a Steward.
- **30. ALL LIVESTOCK MUST BE PARADED** at the times stated in the Program of the Show and when required by the Stewards and under their direction. Attendants must be beside their Animals twenty minutes before the hour of Parade, and be ready to proceed to the Ring immediately on receiving the orders of the Steward. Stock must be led by a responsible, experienced person.
- 31. DOCTORING OF ANY ANIMALS AT THE SHOW. The Association's Veterinary Surgeon or surgeons will examine and report as to any "doctoring" of exhibits for the Show. They are empowered to examine the report on any Animals which have been blistered or punctured, which have or have had teats set, inflated or sealed or which have had soap or other adhesive matter applied to them, and, generally Animals which have been altered in appearance in order to mislead the Judges. Their attention is specially directed to any case in which water or other liquid has been poured into Cattle, to what is known as "gingering" Horses, and to any other practice which causes pain. They may inspect and examine any Animal as soon as it enters the Showground and as long as it may remain there. On their, or his, representation that improper practices on any animal have been resorted to, the animal shall be disqualified from competing for prizes, and the Stewards shall cause it to be removed or prevented from entering the "Show Judging Ring and the offending Exhibitor may be otherwise dealt with as the Directors may consider appropriate.
- 32. IN CASES OF AWARDS TO COWS OR HEIFERS IN CALF, MARES IN FOAL, EWES IN LAMB, the Premiums may be withheld until a Certificate of Produce by a competent Veterinary Surgeon has been produced. Premiums will not be paid should deception have been attempted upon the Judges.
- **33. FULL PARTICULARS MUST BE GIVEN ON ENTRY FORM.** All particulars as to name, pedigree, registration number etc. required in the Entry Form must be filled in. When pedigree, etc. is unknown, this must be stated on the Entry Form.
- **34. JUDGES.** The Committee reserve the right to appoint Judges in place of any who may not be able to attend, or to appoint additional Judges, or to cancel or make alterations to the published list. Judges are not eligible to judge Bred Stock and must inform their Chief Steward who shall in turn be required to appoint an alternative judge.

- **35. GROUPS OR PAIRS.** BEEF INTERBREED GROUP OF 3. Entries may be made in Group of 3 on Saturday. Pairs must be entered on entry form and appropriate fees paid.
- **36. DAIRY SUBSTITUTION.** Between closing date of entries and day of Show, an Exhibitor who has made an entry in the DAIRY Cattle Section will be permitted to substitute for it an entry of another Animal in the same class.

FREE PASSES

Members and Life Members

Every Life Member of The Association and other Members paying an Annual Subscription of not less than $\mathfrak{L}15.00$ shall receive a Member's Ticket admitting them to the Showground. The subscription for the current year must have been paid prior to the Show.

Exhibitors

Each Exhibitor will be issued with a wristband, (for personal use only) entitling entry to the Showground.

Leaders of Stock

Leaders, bona-fide, attending on Stock, are admitted free to the Showground WITH THEIR STOCK on display of the appropriate Vehicle Pass and Wristband. The number of Exhibitor Wristbands allotted to each Exhibitor will be at the discretion of the Association. Attendants arriving at the Show separately will be liable to admission charges.

Passes Not Transferable

Passes are not transferable, and anyone found making an improper use of same will be reported to the Directors. The Stewards are empowered in their respective Sections to check improper use of Free Passes.

HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY

Standards and Rules form part of the Exhibitor Entry Form and a condition of Entry will be an acceptance of these rules and regulations

- A Safety Advisor has been appointed to ensure the safety of the event and the implementation of the Safety Policy.
- 2. Extra stewards are appointed to ensure all safety precautions are complied with and the Chief Steward in each Section will be in charge of their own Section.
- Animals being moved through the event area will be separated from the public by roped off walkways and the movement of animals to judging rings will be organised to create as little stress as possible.
- Bull(s) should be secured by rings or screws. All animals must be securely tied with a halter and a neck rope.
- 5. The use of a 'Humbug' is mandatory for all beef animals over age of 6 months.
- Animals which are excited or aggressive should not be paraded and may require to be withdrawn from the event
- Children should not be allowed to handle bulls or fractious animals. In the Juvenile classes an adult should always be in attendance to take over if a child is having difficulty in controlling an animal
- 8. Dogs should be kept on the lead at all times.
- Any plant, machinery or equipment used prior to, or after the Show should only be operated by an adult who is fully trained in its safe use. Children must not be allowed to ride on or operate machinery including All Terrain Vehicles.
- 10. Pedestrian access routes from Car Parks will be clearly signposted.
- 11. Exhibitors, trade stands, caterers, retailers etc using LPG Gas must comply with HSE regulations in respect of storage and use of any containers that they may bring.
- 12. First Aid facilities will be provided on the day of the Show and these will be clearly signposted and identified.
- 13. Emergency Services will have access to all parts of the Showground at all times.
- 14. In the event of a major incident an incident sheet will be available from the Secretary's Tent on which proper information will be recorded immediately.



Animals moving to shows for exhibition for the first time will not have to be kept separate prior to moving to the show irrespective of whether any other livestock have been moved onto those premises in the 13 day period immediately before moving. If attending only one show within any one 13 day period the animal will not require to be held separate on return from the show nor will the return home trigger a 13 day standstill for any other animal on the home farm. Also animals may move from show to show or may return to their usual premise of residence without triggering a 13 day standstill provided they are kept in separate facilities under an authorised separation agreement with SGRD. In all cases the standstill period for pigs is 20 days.

Animals coming cross-border to shows from England or Wales (or vice versa) will be subject to the disease control measures which apply in the home countries until such time as they cross the border. Thereafter, the disease control measures in the country being visited will apply. Animals coming from Northern Ireland will have to meet the conditions of import. Once in Scotland all will be subject to the provisions of the Disease Control (Interim Measures) (Scotland) Order 2002 (as amended).

The Transport of Animals (Cleansing and Disinfection) (Scotland) Regulations 2005 applies to vehicles taking animals to and from a show/exhibition.

HEALTH STATUS: SUMMARY SCOTTISH GOVERNMENT

- Any animal coming from a Scottish holding must have a 'negative' herd status for BVD or be individually tested negative for the BVD virus.
- Any animal from a 'not negative' herd cannot move to a show unless it has been individually tested negative for the BVD virus.
- Any animal coming from outside Scotland should either be from a BVD CHeCS accredited herd or be individually tested negative for the BVD virus.

ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION:

CATTLE

Cattle born after 1 January 1998 must have a Defra approved eartag in each ear (double tagging). The tag in each ear must have the same unique number. Such animals will be identified throughout their lifetime by this unique number. Animals born or imported into Great Britain before 1 January 1998 may continue to be identified by a single tag. Cattle born after 1 July 2000 must be identified by all numeric tags.

Tagging Requirements

- The tags used for double tagging are known as the primary and secondary tag. The 'Primary' tag, which may be inserted in either ear, must be made of yellow plastic and be at least 45 mm from top to bottom and at least 55 mm wide; the characters must be a minimum of 5 mm high. The primary tag must bear the symbol of a crown (the GB logo), the letters UK and the unique lifetime identification number.
- The 'Secondary' tag may be of a range of approved materials and models, including metal, plastic 'button' type and other plastic type. It must contain the same information as the primary tag, but may also contain management information. The secondary tag must be in a different ear from the primary tag.

Show Moves

When an animal moves on and off a showground, the steps below should be followed.

- Keeper reports the movement off the holding.
- Show Secretary reports the movements on and off the showground.
- · Keeper reports the movements back on to the holding.

Keepers need to report the movement of cattle off and back on to their holding to BCMS within 3 days of the show.

Keepers must bring documents to the show for each animal:

A cheque book style passport (CPP13); or

A single page passport (CPP52); or

A certificate of registration (CHR3); or

A green passport (CPP1).

If the passport movement summary is full, a continuation sheet should be attached

Sheep and Goats (Records, Identification and Movements) (Scotland) Order 2009

Tagging Requirements:

- Sheep born or identified after 31/12/09 require:-
- Full EID, two identifiers one of which must be electronic. The EID can be contained in a tag, a bolus (an identifier in a container that is swallowed and stays in the animal's stomach) or a pastern tag (band around the animal's lower leg). The options available for identifying sheep are listed below:-
- EID ear tag (preferably yellow) + conventional ear tag (any colour except red and black)
- EID ear tag (preferably yellow) + tattoo
- EID ear tag (preferably yellow) + conventional pastern tag
- EID Bolus + conventional ear tag (must be black)
- EID Bolus + conventional pastern tag (must be black)
- EID pastern tag + conventional ear tag (any colour except red and black)
- Note: a red tag indicates a replacement tag where there is not complete traceability

- · Sheep intended for slaughter under 12 months of age, require a Single Electronic slaughter tag which contains the flock mark only.
- Goats are only required to be double identified and do not require an EID identifier but may be so identified if the owner wishes
- Sheep and Goats born after 18 January 2008 and before 31 December 2009 must be identified with two means of identification (two official ear tags or one official ear tag and a tattoo or, solely in the case of goats, one official ear tag and a pastern mark) bearing the same individual number.
- Older animals born prior to 18 January 2008 and not already officially identified are now also subject to the double identification requirement. However, in the case of animals born prior to 09 July 2005, this will only apply when the animals are to be moved off the holding.

Moves to Shows

A movement document must be completed for each move to and from the show or exhibition showing the number of animals moved at batch level.
