This show is a qualifier for the Caledonian Showing Championships, which offers competitors the opportunity to compete at a top-level Championship Final in Scotland. With a draped main arena, amazing rosettes, special prizes, music, judges from the south and atmospheric Evening Performances, this is the show everyone wants to be part of

This year's show will be held at
Highfield @ Howe, near Ladybank, Fife on 13/14/15 October 2023

Every horse & pony placed 1st in all In hand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. In addition, all 2nd placed animals will qualify in Royal International Horse Show qualifiers. All Champions & Reserves will qualify for the Champion & Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line.

SPS-BS SHETLAND & MINIATURE SHETLAND – FRIDAY CLASSES ONLY

- 2.3** Classes must be confined to SPS-BS registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.
- 2.4** Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.
- 2.5** To enter a stallion in any class (in-hand or performance) at an affiliated show, entire males aged 4 years old and over must have an "S" number and have been successfully through either the SPSBS Stallion assessment prior to 2006 or the current SPSBS Voluntary Veterinary Examination. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In hand colts/stallions of two years old or over must be shown bitted and are advised to display a stallion bridle disc which are available to purchase from the SPSBS.
- 2.6** There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats of the current safety standard must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats of the current safety standard must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. Ridden and driven ponies must be 4 years old or over. In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.

PERTH EQUINE VETS / BHS Scotland Open Working Hunter Riding Series 2023

This competition series is run under Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain (SHB GB), the governing body of all hunter and sports horses' classes. It is the responsibility of organisers and competitors to be familiar with these rules; they can be found at <http://www.sporhorsegb.co.uk>.

Please be aware of the following rules:

- 50 H** All ridden hunters must be shod all round. No pads or surgical shoes are allowed.
- 50 I** No hind boots or bandages of any description are allowed in the collecting ring, warm up or in the actual class in Working Hunter and Ridden Sport Horse classes.
- 50 J** The Society discourages the showing of over fat horses and Judges will take this into consideration when making their awards.

The course: At least 8 and not more than 12 fences, with changes of direction, must be set in a ring large enough to permit jumping fluently at a fair hunting pace. Fences should be rustic or as natural as possible, not easily dislodged, of solid appearance, well filled and with shrubs as wings. Maximum height 3ft 6ins (1.05m), maximum spread 3ft 9ins (1.12m), except open ditch and water. The course **should be set at, or near, maximum** unless the judge considers that the ground makes this unsafe. Normally at least one upright and one spread must be at maximum. **If there is a class prior to this class at your show, there should be a change in track made.**

Qualification: The first THREE qualify for the final, even if they did not jump clear. If one of the first three has already qualified the qualifying card can be passed down to fourth place provided the 4th placed rider jumped clear. If a class has less than 4 entries, only the winner will qualify for the Championships.

Veteran Horse Society – AREA QUALIFIER 2023

First round qualifier for the Veteran Horse Society Supreme Final: VETERAN HORSE OF THE YEAR 2023 (Kindly Sponsored by Allen & Page).

Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each Area Qualifier class will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their cards in the ring and have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership this must be done within 21 days of qualification. It is the competitor's responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge.

Regional Finals are open to members only.

All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, to be held at Arena UK Lincolnshire on 29th September – 01st October 2023. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule which is available mid-season in 2023.

CHAPS (UK)

This show is affiliated to the Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK). Affiliation No. 23-011. Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However, in order to Qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be a current showing member and present their valid Qualifier card.

The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 10th – 12th August 2023. Members to apply in writing to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card.

The following classes (25 to 29) are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers. For full rulings and information on competition/qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members' Handbook; or visit www.chapsuk.com for rulings. Only Skewbald's/Piebald's may compete these classes All Stallions, 4 years old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK). All stallions must wear Stallion ID Discs in the ring without exception.

NB CHAPS (UK) Qualification Cards – please note **competitors are responsible** for completing their own qualification cards for relevant qualifications only. **It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to obtain from CHAPS (UK) Admin, and to carry, their Qualification and Membership Cards.**

Qualification is presented as stated above BUT a horse/pony may only qualify **once** per season for **each** Final it is eligible for.

NPS (The National Pony Society) – Affiliation Number: S1.055

NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part bred are not eligible for Mountain & Moorland Classes. To compete in Show Pony and Show Hunter Pony classes ponies must be registered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register, Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB, the GSB, the AHSB, the AASB or in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part-Breds are not eligible unless entered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register, Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 01st – 3rd August 2023.

The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.

NPS/Corscaron Horse Essentials Home-Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home-Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards MUST be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

The NPS/NIART STUD M&M In Hand Summer Championship (MM-IH)

Classes 38-41 are open to pure bred registered M&M ponies in the main body of their studbook. Owner's membership cards must be shown in the ring to receive qualifications. Foals are not eligible.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championship: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships.

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show **01st – 03rd August 2023.**

NPS/BLACKERTOR & SHARPTOR STUDS M&M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship

(SM-MMIH): A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life member in the M&M In Hand section. The Sponsor's Rosette is also awarded to the pony receiving the qualification.

Membership cards must be presented in the ring to receive the medal and/or the qualification.

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in either the NPS/BLACKERTOR & SHARPTOR Studs M&M In-Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show in Malvern, or at the Championship Show in Scotland. Qualifiers may only compete in one silver medal final.

Exhibitors are deemed to be conversant with these rules.

BSPS SCOTLAND MEMBERS CHAMPION OF THE YEAR Affiliation No. 23-003

This Show is a qualifier for The BSPS Scotland Members Champion of the Year competition to be held at BSPS Scotland Finale Show on the 09th September 2023. 1st prize winners in the Lead Rein and First Ridden Show Pony, Pony of Hunter Type, Heritage M&M classes, Open Show Pony, Open Pony of Show Hunter Type, Open Intermediate SRT and SHT, Heritage M&M Open Ridden classes will qualify. In the event of the 1st placed winner at this show having already qualified for the BSPS Scotland Members Champion of the Year, the qualification will be the highest placed BSPS Scottish Member (not already qualified), from the first THREE ponies placed in each class. The rider/pony combination who qualify in each class will be subject to written confirmation from BSPS Scotland.

BRITISH SHOW PONY SOCIETY Affiliation No. 406

"This Show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society ("B.S.P.S."), and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in B.S.P.S. classes, whether or not members of the B.S.P.S. are subject to the Rules of the B.S.P.S., including the disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the B.S.P.S."
516. **THE B.S.P.S. ROGERS TRUCK SERVICES LTD CHALLENGE**
This show is a qualifier for the B.S.P.S. Challenge. Animals competing in the following Open classes will qualify: - Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Lead Rein of Hunter Type, Show Pony, SHP, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WHP, Intermediate SRT, SH and WH and Open Heritage Lead Rein, First Ridden, Ridden and WHP classes.
517. **ROYAL INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW**
This Show is a qualifier for the R.I.H.S. Only one pony in each of the three Open. Show Pony OR Nursery Stakes OR Open W.H.P. OR Lead Rein Hunter Type, OR Open S.H.P. Classes, OR Lead Rein Class OR First Ridden Class OR Open Intermediate S.R., S.H., and W.H. OR First Ridden, OR Open Heritage Lead Rein and First Ridden, Open Heritage Ridden OR the Anglo and Part Bred classes qualifies, and the highest placed, (not already qualified), from the first THREE ponies placed in each class will qualify.
518. N.B. THE R.I.H.S. QUALIFICATION IS SUBJECT TO CONFIRMATION FROM B.S.P.S. HEAD OFFICE.
519. **THE B.S.P.S. "BINKS FAMILY" CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS**
This show is a qualifier for the B.S.P.S. Binks Family Champion of Champions the 1st prize winners in the following classes will qualify: - Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Lead Rein of Hunter Type, Show Pony, SHP, WHP, Intermediate SRT, SH and WH and open Heritage Lead Rein, First Ridden, Ridden and WHP classes.
520. **THE B.S.P.S. "BINKS FAMILY" MINI W.H.P. CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS**
This show is a qualifier for the B.S.P.S. Binks Family Mini WHP Champion of Champions the 1st prize winners in Open Cradle and Nursery Stakes will qualify.
522. Owners and riders must be B.S.P.S. Members before the date of the show to qualify in classes with qualification for BLUE RIBAND, R.I.H.S., (including Pretty Polly and Heritage qualifying classes). Animals must be registered with the B.S.P.S. except for the Anglo and Part Bred Arabs who must be registered with the AHS. Membership forms and payment must be received in the office no later than the last working day (Monday to Friday) prior to the date of the qualifying show. (See Rule 20)
524. This Show is a qualifier for the 2023 B.S.P.S. Championships Show, to be held at Arena UK. The 1st and 2nd prize winners only in the following classes, (Classes 54-58, 72-75, 81, 82-84), and the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Prize-winners only in the following classes, (Classes 59-61, 80 and 85) will qualify for the B.S.P.S. Championships Show, provided the animal is registered in accordance with Rules 5, 21 and 26 and ridden by a BSPS member.

Measurement of Ponies

13. The Rules on the measurement of ponies are in accordance with the B.S.P.S. and the J.M.B. Rule Book. Copies of the J.M.B. Rule Book may be obtained from the J.M.B. www.thejmbonline.co.uk
14. All animals (except Heritage M&M or Anglo PBA) competing in the R.I.H.S. (HOYS / Blue Riband) qualifiers must have a J.M.B. Full Height Certificate or a valid J.M.B. Annual Height Certificate issued in the current year.
15. Ponies must be measured before the date of any R.I.H.S. (HOYS/ Blue Riband) qualifying shows. Ponies can be called for Measurement by the Society. (See Rule 76)
16. If a pony moves into a different Height Section it takes its CURRENT status in its new Height Section.

Hats

In ALL BSPS Classes, correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats, numbers; PAS015 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2017, ASTM F1163 04a onwards, SNELL E2016, AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards. MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. Velvet covers are encouraged.

Body Protectors

Body Protectors MUST be worn when jumping in any WHP and WH classes including practice ring at B.S.P.S. Affiliated Shows. (Including Tiny Tots, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WSP, LRWSP and Training Stakes). Riders must wear a body protector when working in (practice jumps) and the jumping phase in all B.S.P.S. organised and affiliated events. A British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA) approved and appropriately labelled "Level 3 body protector" with the year 2009 (Purple) or 2018 (Blue and Black) shown on the label manufactured in the year 2009.

BETA recommends body protectors are replaced at least every three to five years, after which the impact absorption properties of the foam may have started to decline.

All types of Air Jackets are not allowed.

ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AFTER THESE DATES and no reminders will be given. Fax and e-mail entries will not be accepted at any time.
2. Thereafter, if circumstances allow 'ON THE DAY ENTRIES' may be accepted AT DOUBLE ENTRY FEE.
3. POSTAL ENTRY FORMS should be filled in as clearly as possible, preferably in BLOCK LETTERS.
The name entered under Exhibitor's Name POSTAL & ONLINE is the one that will be used in the results.
4. COMPLETED POSTAL ENTRY FORMS should be carefully checked and signed by the Exhibitor or their Agent and sent by post to: Light Horse Entries, Ayr County Show, Maple Park (C/o Semex UK), Kilmarnock Road, Monkton, Ayrshire, KA9 2RJ. Please ensure parents countersign children's entries.
COMPLETED ONLINE ENTRY will require to be carefully checked with Rules & Regulations of the Association AGREED.
5. NO REFUND OF ENTRIES WILL BE MADE.
6. ADMISSION TICKET ALLOCATIONS FOR LIGHT HORSE & PONY SECTION: 1 horse – 2 wristbands; 2-4 horses – 3 wristbands; over 4 horses – 5 wristbands.
Additional Admission wristbands can be bought at £ 12.00 per person Saturday ONLY.
NO Wristbands will be required for FRIDAY classes.
7. POSTAL PAYMENT - all entries must be accompanied by the correct amount, cheques or postal orders made payable to AYRSHIRE AGRICULTURAL ASSOCIATION. MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. Velvet covers are encouraged.
The BSPS encourages members to have their hats tagged through the BSPS scheme or via the Pony Club Scheme. Hat Tagging in BSPS classes is compulsory (we are accepting British Eventing, British Riding Club and Pony Club tag).

19. The Horse Passports (Scotland) Regulations 2005, Amended 2007, replaces the Horse Passport (Scotland) Regulations 2005, and requires all Equidae (horses, ponies, donkeys, asses and mules), regardless of age or status, to be accompanied by a passport. Animals born or passports issued, on or after 1 July 2009 must be fitted with a microchip.
This would include, without exception, equines used for agricultural purposes, riding ponies, pets, companion animals, hacks, competition animals etc. Foals that are un-weaned and accompanying their dam or foster mare may move to a show without a passport.
Passports can be held by the horse owner or keeper but should remain with the horse at all times; in particular, passports must accompany the horse when it is moved.
20. All animals attending the Show must have proof of an up-to-date vaccination record. It is mandatory that all horses/ponies/donkeys are fully vaccinated against Equine Influenza (Flu) within the 6 months directly before the show. Passports may be inspected at any time; any horse without a valid vaccination protocol or owner/exhibitor unable to produce a valid passport will lead to immediate eviction of that horse/pony/donkey from the showground. (Foals are exempt so long as they are less than 6 months old and the mare is fully vaccinated).
21. The Organisers retain the right to amend the schedule to facilitate the smooth running of the show.
22. Foul language or abusive behaviour towards people or animals will NOT be tolerated, and will result in expulsion from the Show ground.
23. Competitors are required to take home any rubbish as a matter of courtesy.
