EXHIBITORS WRISTBANDS

Each Exhibitor will be issued with allocated number of wristbands, for personal use only, entitling entry to the Showground. Wristbands are not transferable.

EXHIBITORS' CAR PARK

Exhibitor Car/lorry passes will be sent out with Admission Wristband's. Lorries or cars not displaying an official pass will be directed by Traffic Police/Security to the Public Car Park.

Horse Passports - The Horse Passports (Scotland) Regulations 2005, Amended 2007, replaces the Horse Passport (Scotland) Regulations 2005, and requires all Equidae (horses, ponies, donkeys, asses and mules), regardless of age or status, to be accompanied by a passport. Animals born or passports issued, on or after 1 July 2009 must be fitted with a microchip. This would include, without exception, equines used for agricultural purposes, riding ponies, pets, companion animals, hacks, competition animals etc. Foals that are un-weaned and accompanying their dam or foster mare may move to a show without a passport. Passports can be held by the horse owner or keeper but should remain with the horse at all times; in particular, passports must accompany the horse when it is moved.

Equine Influenza Vaccination - All animals attending the Show must have proof of an up-to-date vaccination record. It is mandatory that all horses/ponies/donkeys are fully vaccinated against Equine Influenza (Flu) within the 6 months directly before the show. Passports may be inspected at any time; any horse without a valid vaccination protocol or owner/exhibitor unable to produce a valid passport will lead to immediate eviction of that horse/pony/donkey from the showground. (Foals are exempt so long as they are less than 6 months old and the mare is fully vaccinated).

Random checks will be carried out on both of the above.

Caledonian Showing Championships



This show is a qualifier for the Caledonian Showing Championships, which offers competitors the opportunity to compete at a top-level Championship Final in Scotland. With a draped main arena, amazing rosettes, special prizes, music, judges from the south and atmospheric Evening Performances, this is the show everyone wants to be part of.

This year's show will be held at:

Highfield @ Howe, near Ladybank, Fife on 18/19/20 October 2024

Every horse & pony placed 1st in all In hand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. All Champions & Reserves will qualify for the Champion & Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line. All qualified horses and ponies will be listed on the Caledonian Showing Championship Show's website: www.caledonianchampionships.webs.com or the Puddledub Shows Facebook page.

SPS-BS SHETLAND & MINIATURE SHETLAND

- 2.3 Classes must be confined to SPS-BS registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.
- 2.4 Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.
- 2.5 To enter a stallion in any class (in-hand or performance) at an affiliated show, entire males aged 4 years old and over must have an "S" number and have been successfully through either the SPSBS Stallion assessment prior to 2006 or the current SPSBS Voluntary Veterinary Examination. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In hand colts/stallions of two years old or over must be shown bitted and are advised to display a stallion bridle disc which are available to purchase from the SPSBS.
- 2.6 There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats of the current safety standard must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats of the current safety standard must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. Ridden and driven ponies must be 4 years old or over. In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.

PERTH EQUINE VETS / BHS Scotland Open Working Hunter Riding Series 2024

This competition series is run under Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain (SHB GB), the governing body of all hunter and sports horses' classes. It is the responsibility of organisers and competitors to be familiar with these rules; they can be found at http://www.sporthorsegb.co.uk.

Please be aware of the following rules:

- 50 H All ridden hunters must be shod all round. No pads or surgical shoes are allowed.
- 50 I No hind boots or bandages of any description are allowed in the collecting ring, warm up or in the actual class in Working Hunter and Ridden Sport Horse classes.
- 50 J The Society discourages the showing of over fat horses and Judges will take this into consideration when making their awards.

The course: At least 8 and not more than 12 fences, with changes of direction, must be set in a ring large enough to permit jumping fluently at a fair hunting pace. Fences should be rustic or as natural as possible, not easily dislodged, of solid appearance, well filled and with shrubs as wings. Maximum height 3ft 6ins (1.05m), maximum spread 3ft 9ins (1.12m), except open ditch and water. The course should be set at, or near, maximum unless the judge considers that the ground makes this unsafe. Normally at least one upright and one spread must be at maximum. If there is a class prior to this class at your show, there should be a change in track made.

Qualification: The first THREE qualify for the final, even if they did not jump clear. If one of the first three has already qualified the qualifying card can be passed down to fourth place provided the 4th placed rider jumped clear. If a class has less than 4 entries, only the winner will qualify for the Championships.

Veteran Horse Society – AREA QUALIFIER 2024

First round qualifier for the Veteran Horse Society Supreme Final: VETERAN HORSE OF THE YEAR 2024 (Kindly Sponsored by Allen & Page).

Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each Area Qualifier class will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their cards in the ring and have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership <u>this must be done within 21 days of qualification</u>. It is the competitor's responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge.

Regional Finals are open to members only.

All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, to be held at Arena UK Lincolnshire on 30th August – 01st September 2024. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule which is available mid-season in 2024.

CHAPS (UK)

This show is affiliated to the Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK). Affiliation No. 24-092. Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However, in order to Qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be a current showing member and present their valid Qualifier card.

The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 15th – 17th August 2024. Members to apply in writing to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card.

The following classes (8 to 12) are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers. For full rulings and information on competition/qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members' Handbook; or visit www.chapsuk.com for rulings. Only Skewbald's/Piebald's may compete these classes All Stallions, 4 years old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK). All stallions must wear Stallion ID Discs in the ring without exception.

NB CHAPS (UK) Qualification Cards - please note competitors are responsible for completing their own qualification cards for relevant qualifications only. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to obtain from CHAPS (UK) Admin, and to carry, their **Qualification and Membership Cards.**

Qualification is presented as stated above BUT a horse/pony may only qualify once per season for each Final it is eligible for.

NPS (The National Pony Society) – Affiliation Number: S1.063

NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part breds are not eligible for Mountain & Moorland Classes. To compete in Show Pony and Show Hunter Pony classes ponies must be registered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register, Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB, the GSB, the AHSB, the AASB or in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part-Breds are not eligible unless entered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register, Appendix, International or Sports Ponv section of the BRPSB.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 06th – 8th August 2024.

The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will gualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.

NPS/Corscaron Horse Essentials Home-Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home-Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards MUST be produced in the ring when requested or the gualification will be forfeit.

The NPS/ABSORBINES M&M In Hand Summer Championship (MM-IH)

Classes 37-40 are open to pure bred registered M&M ponies in the main body of their studbook. Owner's membership cards must be shown in the ring to receive qualifications. Foals are not eligible.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championship: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously gualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships.

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 06th - 08th August 2024.

NPS/BLACKERTOR & SHARPTOR STUDS M&M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship

(SM-MMIH): A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life member in the M&M In Hand section. The Sponsor's Rosette is also awarded to the pony receiving the qualification.

Membership cards must be presented in the ring to receive the medal and/or the qualification.

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in either the NPS/BLACKERTOR & SHARPTOR Studs M&M In-Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show in Malvern, or at the Championship Show in Scotland. Qualifiers may only compete in one silver medal final.

- 509. "This Show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society ("B.S.P.S."), and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in B.S.P.S. classes, whether or not members of the B.S.P.S. are subject to the Rules of the B.S.P.S., including the disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the B.S.P.S."
- 516. <u>THE B.S.P.S. CHALLENGE</u> This show is a qualifier for the B.S.P.S. Challenge. Animals competing in the following Open classes will qualify: - Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Lead Rein of Hunter Type, Show Pony, SHP, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WHP, Intermediate SRT, SH and WH and Open Heritage Lead Rein, First Ridden, Ridden and WHP classes.
- 519. <u>THE B.S.P.S. "BINKS FAMILY" CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS</u> This show is a qualifier for the B.S.P.S. Binks Family Champion of Champions the 1st prize winners in the following classes will qualify: - Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Lead Rein of Hunter Type, Show Pony, SHP, WHP, Intermediate SRT, SH and WH and open Heritage Lead Rein, First Ridden, Ridden and WHP classes.
- 520. <u>THE B.S.P.S. "BINKS FAMILY" MINI W.H.P. CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS</u> This show is a qualifier for the B.S.P.S. Binks Family Mini WHP Champion of Champions the 1st prize winners in Open Cradle and Nursery Stakes will qualify.
- 524. This Show is a qualifier for the 2024 BSPS Championships Show to be held at Arena UK. The 1st and 2nd prize winners only in the following classes Open LR, FR, SP, NS and the 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize winners in Classes Open Intermediate SRT (including Mixed height), W.H & SHT, CS and Heritage classes the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th prize winners in mixed height classes will qualify for the BSPS Championships provided the animal is registered in accordance with Rules 5, 21 and 26 and ridden by a BSPS member.

Hats

Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS015 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023, SNELL E2016 and E2021, AS/NZS 3838 2006, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover, either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. Velvet covers are encouraged. The B.S.P.S. encourages members to have their hats tagged through the B.S.P.S. scheme or via the Pony Club Scheme. Tagging indicates that the hat meets the accepted standards, no check of the fit or condition of the hat is implied. It is considered to be the responsibility of the members/guardians to ensure the hat complies with the current standards and is tagged before they compete. Members/guardians are responsible for ensuring the manufacturer's guidelines with regard to fit and replacement are followed. Hat Tagging in B.S.P.S. classes is compulsory at BSPS Winter, Summer and Heritage Championship shows, Royal International Horse Show, London International Horse Show, Burghley Gold Cup and lead rein WSP final. (We are accepting British Eventing, British Riding Club and Pony Club tags)

Body Protectors

Body Protectors MUST be worn when jumping in any WHP and WH classes Including practice rings at B.S.P.S. affiliated shows. (Including Tiny Tots, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WSP, LRWSP and Training Stakes). Riders must wear a body protector when working in (practice jumps) and the jumping phase in all B.S.P.S. organised and affiliated events. A British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA) approved and appropriately labelled "Level 3 body protector" 2018 (Blue and Black) shown on the label. BETA recommends body protectors are replaced at least every three to five years, after which the impact absorption properties of the foam may have started to decline. All types of Air Jackets are not allowed.

- 50 I No hind boots or bandages of any description are allowed in the collecting ring, warm up or in the actual class in Working Hunter and Ridden Sport Horse classes.
- 50 J The Society discourages the showing of over fat horses and Judges will take this into consideration when making their awards.

The rider must be a member of the British Horse Society for the Championship held at the Final at Blair Castle Horse Trials. Riders must be eighteen years or over on the day of the Finals.

The Course: At least 8 and not more than 12 fences, with changes of direction, must be set in a ring large enough to permit jumping fluently at a fair hunting pace. Fences should be rustic or as natural as possible, not easily dislodged, of solid appearance, well filled and with shrubs as wings. Maximum height 3ft 6ins (1.05m), maximum spread 3ft 9ins (1.12m), except open ditch and water. The course should be set at, or near, maximum unless the judge considers that the ground makes this unsafe. Normally at least one upright and one spread must be at maximum. Body Protectors

Body Protectors MUST be worn when jumping in any WHP and WH classes Including practice rings at B.S.P.S. affiliated shows. (Including Tiny Tots, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WSP, LRWSP and Training Stakes). Riders must wear a body protector when working in (practice jumps) and the jumping phase in all B.S.P.S. organised and affiliated events. A British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA) approved and appropriately labelled "Level 3 body protector" 2018 (Blue and Black) shown on the label. BETA recommends body protectors are replaced at least every three to five years, after which the impact absorption properties of the foam may have started to decline. All types of Air Jackets are not allowed.

This show is a qualifier for The Royal Highland Show Nursery Stakes 2024 – Class 61. The first 3 placed same pony and rider combination will qualify for the 2024 Royal Highland Show Nursery Stakes provided they have jumped a clear round. Qualification will only move down the line to the next eligible pony and rider combination meeting the qualification criteria and with approval of the BSPS Scotland Secretary.

- Class 59 BSPS Cradle Stakes mare or gelding, four years old or over, not exceeding 122cm. Riders not to have attained their 11th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Open to both members and non-members of the BSPS.
- Class 60 BSPS Nursery Stakes mare or gelding, four years old or over, not exceeding 133cm. Riders not to have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Open to both members and non-members of the BSPS.
- Class 61 Royal Highland Show BSPS Nursery Stakes Qualifier mare or gelding, four years old or over, not exceeding 133cm. Riders not to have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Open to both members and non-members of the BSPS.

- Class 62 BSPS Mixed Height NOVICE WHP mare or gelding, four years old or over, not exceeding 158cm. Riders may ride more than one pony providing the animals are of a different height section. - Class 63 BSPS Mixed Height OPEN WHP/INTERMEDIATE WHP mare or gelding, four years old or over, not exceeding 158cm. Riders MUST jump in their correct height section and be the correct age for the height of the animal they ride. Riders may ride more than one pony providing the animals are of a different height section. Riders must declare if they are competing in the 153cms or the Intermediate Section. Open to both members and non-members of the BSPS.

1. POSTAL ENTRY FORMS should be lodged with the Light Horse Secretary as early as possible and NO LATER THAN the Wednesday 17th April 2024.

ONLINE ENTRIES should be lodged by Wednesday 17th April 2024.

ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AFTER THESE DATES and no reminders will be given. Fax and e-mail entries will not be accepted at any time.

- 2. Thereafter, if circumstances allow 'ON THE DAY ENTRIES' may be accepted AT DOUBLE ENTRY FEE.
- 3. POSTAL ENTRY FORMS should be filled in as clearly as possible, preferably in BLOCK LETTERS.
- The name entered under Exhibitor's Name POSTAL & ONLINE is the one that will be used in the results.
- COMPLETED POSTAL ENTRY FORMS should be carefully checked and signed by the Exhibitor or their Agent and sent by post to: Light Horse Entries, Ayr County Show, Maple Park (C/o Semex UK), 23 Kilmarnock Road, Monkton, Ayrshire, KA9 2RJ. Please ensure parents countersign children's entries.

COMPLETED ONLINE ENTRY will require to be carefully checked with Rules & Regulations of the Association AGREED.

- 5. NO REFUND OF ENTRIES WILL BE MADE.
- ADMISSION TICKET ALLOCATIONS FOR LIGHT HORSE & PONY SECTION: 1 horse 2 wristbands; 2-4 horses 3 wristbands; over 4 horses 5 wristbands.
- Additional Admission wristbands can be bought at \pounds 16.00 per person.
- POSTAL PAYMENT all entries must be accompanied by the correct amount, cheques or postal orders made payable to AYRSHIRE AGRICULTURAL ASSOCIATION. No entry will be deemed to be accepted until all entry monies have been paid. COMPETITORS CHEQUES NOT HONOURED BY THE BANK will incur bank charges plus 10% administration charges. ONLINE ENTRIES PAYMENT – via Stripe where an Administration Cost of £2.50 is added prior to payment.
- RIGHT RESERVED TO REFUSE ENTRIES. The Show Committee reserves to themselves the right of refusing or cancelling entries from any person.
- 9. The Committee reserves the right to combine any classes in the event of insufficient entries or split the class in the event of oversubscribed entries.
- 10. THE AYRSHIRE AGRICULTURAL ASSOCIATION IS NOT LIABLE FOR LOSS OR DAMAGE, neither will the Association be accountable for any accident that may occur to any person attending the Show whether as a visitor, exhibitor or otherwise.
- 11. The Judge has the FINAL decision on Entry to the Ring.
- 12. The Ayrshire Agricultural Association will not be held responsible for exhibitors being late for a class.
- 13. All animals MUST be sound. If in the opinion of the Judge, an animal is considered to be unsound it will be asked to leave the ring.
- 14. PROTESTS any protest must be lodged by a person having an interest. The said objections must be lodged in writing with the Secretary at the Show or within seven days of the Show, and must state specifically the grounds of objection, and must be accompanied by a deposit of £100.
- 15. WEARING OF RIDING HATS In ALL Classes, correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS015 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023, SNELL E2016 and E2021, AS/NZS 3838 2006, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover, either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. Velvet covers are encouraged. The B.S.P.S. encourages members to have their hats tagged through the B.S.P.S. scheme or via the Pony Club Scheme. Tagging indicates that the hat meets the accepted standards, no check of the fit or condition of the hat is implied. It is considered to be the responsibility of the members/guardians to ensure the hat complies with the current standards and is tagged before they compete. Members/guardians are responsible for ensuring the manufacturer's guidelines with regard to fit and replacement are followed. Hat Tagging in B.S.P.S. classes is compulsory at BSPS Winter, Summer and Heritage Championship shows, Royal International Horse Show, London International Horse Show, Burghley Gold Cup and lead rein WSP final. (We are accepting British Eventing, British Riding Club and Pony Club tags)
- 16. Body Protectors MUST be worn when jumping in any WHP and WH classes Including practice rings at B.S.P.S. affiliated shows. (Including Tiny Tots, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WSP, LRWSP and Training Stakes). Riders must wear a body protector when working in (practice jumps) and the jumping phase in all B.S.P.S. organised and affiliated events. A British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA) approved and appropriately labelled "Level 3 body protector" 2018 (Blue and Black) shown on the label. - 17. DOGS should be kept on the lead at all times.
- 18. STABLES There will be no stabling at Ayr Racecourse for exhibitors this year. Please contact the office 0845 2011460 / 07753 806670 for recommendations or see Page 2 of schedule.
- 19. The Horse Passports (Scotland) Regulations 2005, Amended 2007, replaces the Horse Passport (Scotland) Regulations 2005, and requires all Equidae (horses, ponies, donkeys, asses and mules), regardless of age or status, to be accompanied by a passport. Animals born or passports issued, on or after 1 July 2009 must be fitted with a microchip. This would include, without exception, equines used for agricultural purposes, riding ponies, pets, companion animals, hacks, competition animals etc. Foals that are un-weaned and accompanying their dam or foster mare may move to a show without a passport. Passports can be held by the horse owner or keeper but should remain with the horse at all times; in particular, passports must accompany the horse when it is moved.
- 20. All animals attending the Show must have proof of an up-to-date vaccination record. It is mandatory that all horses/ponies/donkeys are fully vaccinated against Equine Influenza (Flu) within the 6 months directly before the show. Passports may be inspected at any time; any horse without a valid vaccination protocol or owner/exhibitor unable to produce a valid passport will lead to immediate eviction of that horse/pony/donkey from the showground. (Foals are exempt so long as they are less than 6 months old and the mare is fully vaccinated).
- 21. The Organisers retain the right to amend the schedule to facilitate the smooth running of the show.
- 22. Foul language or abusive behaviour towards people or animals will NOT be tolerated, and will result in expulsion from the Show ground.
- 23. Competitors are required to take home any rubbish as a matter of courtesy.
- 24. First aid cover will be available for the duration of the show.
- 25. A Vet will be available for the duration of the show.
- 26. No Farrier will be available.
