EXHIBITORS WRISTBANDS

Each Exhibitor will be issued with allocated number of wristbands, for personal use only, entitling entry to the Showground. Wristbands are not transferable.

EXHIBITORS' CAR PARK

Exhibitor Car/lorry passes will be sent out with Admission Wristband's.

Lorries or cars not displaying an official pass will be directed by Traffic Police/Security to the Public Car Park.

*****Equine Influenza Vaccination** - As Ayr County Show takes place at Ayr Racecourse, we require to conform to BHA Vaccination rules (Equine Influenza) as follows:

ALL HORSES / PONIES attending a Racecourse will require a valid vaccination course with annual boosters being suffice providing that the equine has been vaccinated WITHIN 6 MONTHS of the date of the event (10th May 2025) which means most up to date vaccination requires to be administered between November 2024 & April 2025. At time of online entry, it will be mandatory to upload copies of Passport & Vaccination for checking. The BHA will carry out spot checks during approved events. (Foals are exempt so long as they are less than 6 months old, and the mare is fully vaccinated). ***

Horse Passports - The Horse Passports (Scotland) Regulations 2005, Amended 2007, replaces the Horse Passport (Scotland) Regulations 2005, and requires all Equidae (horses, ponies, donkeys, asses and mules), regardless of age or status, to be accompanied by a passport. Animals born or passports issued, on or after 1 July 2009 must be fitted with a microchip. This would include, without exception, equines used for agricultural purposes, riding ponies, pets, companion animals, hacks, competition animals etc. Foals that are un-weaned and accompanying their dam or foster mare may move to a show without a passport. Passports can be held by the horse owner or keeper but should always remain with the horse; in particular, passports must accompany the horse when it is moved.

Caledonian Showing Championships



This show is a qualifier for the Caledonian Showing Championships, which is now fully established as the biggest and best way to end Scottish showing season.

This year's show will be held at:

Howe EC, near Ladybank, Fife on 17/18/19 October 2025

Every horse & pony placed 1st in all In hand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. All Champions & Reserves will qualify for the Champion & Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line. All qualified horses and ponies will be listed on the Puddledub Show's Facebook page and the website https://puddledubshows.weeblv.com

SPS-BS SHETLAND & MINIATURE SHETLAND

- 2.3 Classes must be confined to SPS-BS registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.
- 2.4 Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.
- 2.5 To enter a stallion in any class (in-hand or performance) at an affiliated show, entire males aged 4 years old and over must have an "S" number and have been successfully through either the SPSBS Stallion assessment prior to 2006 or the current SPSBS Voluntary Veterinary Examination. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In hand colts/stallions of two years old or over must be shown bitted and are advised to display a stallion bridle disc which are available to purchase from the SPSBS.
- 2.6 There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats of the current safety standard must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats of the current safety standard must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. Ridden and driven ponies must be 4 years old or over. In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted and take no further part.

PERTH EQUINE VETS / BHS Scotland Open Working Hunter Riding Series 2025

This competition series is run under Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain (SHB GB), the governing body of all hunter and sports horses' classes. It is the responsibility of organisers and competitors to be familiar with these rules; they can be found at http://www.sporthorsegb.co.uk.

Scone Palace International Horse Trials will be the Championship Venue for the BHS Scotland Competition Series in 2025 - the Championship is scheduled to take place on Thursday 21 August 2025.

Please be aware of the following rules:

- 50 H All ridden hunters must be shod all round. No pads or surgical shoes are allowed.
- No hind boots or bandages of any description are allowed in the collecting ring, warm up or in the actual class in Working Hunter and Ridden Sport Horse classes.
- The Society discourages the showing of over fat horses and Judges will take this into consideration when making their awards.

The course: At least 8 and not more than 12 fences, with changes of direction, must be set in a ring large enough to permit jumping fluently at a fair hunting pace. Fences should be rustic or as natural as possible, not easily dislodged, of solid appearance, well filled and with shrubs as wings. Maximum height 3ft 6ins (1.05m), maximum spread 3ft 9ins (1.12m), except open ditch and water. The course should be set at, or near, maximum unless the judge considers that the ground makes this unsafe. Normally at least one upright and one spread must be at maximum. If there is a class prior to this class at your show, there should be a change in track made.

Qualification: The first THREE qualify for the final, even if they did not jump clear. If one of the first three has already qualified the qualifying card can be passed down to fourth place provided the 4th placed rider jumped clear. If a class has less than 4 entries, only the winner will qualify for the Championships.

Veteran Horse Society - AREA QUALIFIER 2025

First round qualifier for the Veteran Horse Society Supreme Final: VETERAN HORSE OF THE YEAR 2025 (Kindly Sponsored by Allen & Page).

Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each Area Qualifier class will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their cards in the ring and have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership *this must be done within 21 days of qualification*. It is the competitor's responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge.

Regional Finals are open to members only.

All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, to be held at Arena UK Lincolnshire on 29th August – 31st August 2025. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule which is available mid-season in 2025.

CHAPS (UK)

This show is affiliated to the Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK). Affiliation No. 25-020. Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However, in order to Qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be a current showing member and present their valid Qualifier card.

The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 14th – 16th August 2025. Members to apply in writing to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card.

The following classes (18 to 22) are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers. For full rulings and information on competition/qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members' Handbook; or visit www.chapsuk.com for rulings. Only Skewbald's/Piebald's may compete these classes

All Stallions, 4 years old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK). All stallions must wear Stallion ID Discs in the ring without exception.

NB CHAPS (UK) Qualification Cards – please note **competitors are responsible** for completing their own qualification cards for relevant qualifications only. **It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to obtain from CHAPS (UK) Admin, and to carry, their Qualification and Membership Cards.**

Qualification is presented as stated above BUT a horse/pony may only qualify **once** per season for **each** Final it is eligible for.

NPS (The National Pony Society) - Affiliation Number: S1.074.

NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part breds are not eligible for Mountain & Moorland Classes. To compete in Show Pony and Show Hunter Pony classes ponies must be registered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register, Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB, the GSB, the AHSB, the AASB or in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part-Breds are not eligible unless entered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register, Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from $05^{th} - 7^{th}$ August 2025.

The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.

NPS/Corscaron Horse Essentials Home-Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home-Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards MUST be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

The NPS/ABSORBINES M&M In Hand Summer Championship (MM-IH)

Classes 34-37 are open to pure bred registered M&M ponies in the main body of their studbook. Owner's membership cards must be shown in the ring to receive qualifications. Foals are not eligible.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championship: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships.

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show **05**th **– 07**th **August 2025**.

NPS/BLACKERTOR & SHARPTOR STUDS M&M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship

(SM-MMIH): A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life member in the M&M In Hand section. The Sponsor's Rosette is also awarded to the pony receiving the qualification. Membership cards must be presented in the ring to receive the medal and/or the qualification. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in either the NPS/BLACKERTOR & SHARPTOR Studs M&M In-Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show in Malvern, or at the Championship Show in Scotland. Qualifiers may only compete in one silver medal final.

TO BE RUN UNDER NPS SCOTLAND FINALS (SCONE PALACE) RULES 2025 which are on the NPS Scotland website www.npsscotland.co.uk These rules clarify areas particular to NPS Scotland. We also run to the Rules of the NPS and again these can be found on our website. Exhibitors are deemed to be conversant with these rules.

BRITISH SHOW PONY SOCIETY Affiliation No. 2025-S-001

- 509. "This Show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society ("B.S.P.S."), and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in B.S.P.S. classes, whether or not members of the B.S.P.S. are subject to the Rules of the B.S.P.S., including the disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the B.S.P.S."
- 516. THE B.S.P.S. CHALLENGE
 - This show is a qualifier for the B.S.P.S. Challenge. Animals competing in the following Open classes will qualify: Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Lead Rein of Hunter Type, Show Pony, SHP, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WHP, Intermediate SRT, SH and WH and Open Heritage Lead Rein, First Ridden, Ridden and WHP classes.
- 520. THE B.S.P.S. "BINKS FAMILY" MINI W.H.P. CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS
 This show is a qualifier for the B.S.P.S. Binks Family Mini WHP Champion of Champions the 1st prize winners in Open Cradle and Nursery Stakes will qualify.

<u>Hats</u>

Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS015 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023, SNELL E2016 and E2021, AS/NZS 3838 2006, MUST be always worn by riders when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover, either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. Velvet covers are encouraged. The B.S.P.S. encourages members to have their hats tagged through the B.S.P.S. scheme or via the Pony Club Scheme. Tagging indicates that the hat meets the accepted standards, no check of the fit or condition of the hat is implied. It is the responsibility of the members/guardians to ensure the hat complies with the current standards and is tagged before they compete. Members/guardians are responsible for ensuring the manufacturer's guidelines regarding fit and replacement are followed. Hat Tagging in B.S.P.S. classes is compulsory at BSPS Winter, Summer and Heritage Championship shows, Royal International Horse Show, London International Horse Show, Burghley Gold Cup and lead rein WSP final. (We are accepting British Eventing, British Riding Club and Pony Club tags)

BODY PROTECTORS

50. Body Protectors MUST be worn when jumping in any WHP and WH classes Including practice rings at B.S.P.S. affiliated shows. (Including Tiny Tots, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WSP, LRWSP and Training Stakes). Riders must wear a body protector when working in (practice jumps) and the jumping phase in all B.S.P.S. organised and affiliated events. A British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA) appr

organised and affiliated events. A British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA) approved and appropriately labelled "Level 3 body protector" 2018 (Blue) shown on the label. BETA recommends body protectors are replaced at least every three to five years, after which the impact absorption properties of the foam may have started to decline. All types of Air Jackets are not allowed except with medical dispensation.

<u>SPURS</u>

51. The wearing of spurs in ALL classes held under B.S.P.S. Rules is forbidden.

WHIPS

52. In ALL classes held under B.S.P.S. Rules whips are not to exceed 75cms (30ins). Hunting Crops are permissible. This includes whips/sticks used by leaders in lead rein classes. Padded whips are recommended for WHP classes. A whip, if carried, must be held in the hand by the handle with the handle at the top.

At all times the whip must be used; For a good reason, as an aid to encourage the horse/pony forward. At an appropriate time, namely when the horse/pony is reluctant to go forward with the normal aids of seat and legs. In the right place, namely down the shoulder or behind the leg. Never over arm. With appropriate severity. No more than twice for any incident. Riders must not hit a horse/pony before the start of a jumping course.

Excessive use of a whip anywhere on a showground will result in disqualification of the horse and rider from any classes entered on that day.

This includes, but not limited to:

Use of the whip to vent a competitor's anger is always excessive.

Use of the whip which causes injury, e.g. broken skin or weal is always excessive.

Use after elimination or retirement is always excessive.

Use on the horse/pony's head and neck is always excessive.

Using a whip from the ground after a fall or dismount is always excessive.

If the rider's arm comes above the shoulder when using the whip this is always excessive.

Judge: Mrs J L Lowthian, Penrith, Cumbria To be judged on Saturday 10th May in Ring 1 Commencing at 8.00am

NPS Scotland/Townhead Pet N Pony In-hand M & M Championship.

Handler any age, except stallions. Foals are not eligible. The owner does not have to be an NPS Scotland member for the pony to enter this competition, but the owner must become a member to enter the final. The Champion & Res. Champion in all Mixed Pure-bred M. & M. or Breed Championships will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 22nd August 2025. Qualification may go to 3rd in the Championship (i.e., 1st Reserve Champion).

NPS Scotland/Baileys Horse Feeds Open Ridden M. & M. Championship.

Rider any age, except stallions. The owner does not have to be an NPS Scotland member for the pony to enter this competition, but the owner must become a member to enter the final. To be shown in any suitable bridle.

All ponies forward for final judging may be stripped but this is not mandatory. All ponies must be stripped in the NPS Final. The 2 highest placed ponies will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 22nd August 2025. Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place. This can be either mixed M. & M. or Breed Classes.

- Class 1 Highland Pony STALLION, MARE OR GELDING, 4-year-old or over (Special Rosette will be awarded for Highest Placed Yearling)
- Class 2 Highland Pony COLT, FILLY OR GELDING, Yearling, 2 or 3-year-old (Special Rosette will be awarded for Highest Placed Yearling)

Highland Pony In-Hand Championship – 1st and 2nd prize-winner in class 1 & 2 compete.

Class 3 Highland Pony under saddle – registered Highland pony, four years old and over. This class may be ridden.

Overall, Highland Pony Championship – 1st and 2nd prize-winner in class 3 compete with the Highland Pony In-Hand champion and reserve.
